Barriers of Communication

- People with learning disabilities in our project are not included by the use of ICT

Barriers of Communication

- People with learning disabilities are not effectively included in the project as a whole
- The use of ICT until now does not promote inclusion
- Mirror of reality in societies
- Mirror of reality in European Projects
- Communication about but not with the groups in question

Barriers of Communication

Within each local partnership

- ICT are in use
- 'regular/normal' problems of communication

This problems partly result from the use of ICT

- Is the information provided used regularly?
- Are all emails being read?

Barriers of Communication

Between the local partnerships

- Use of ICT
- ‘regular/normal’ problems of communication
- Different languages
English/German/Dutch/Swedish/Spanish
- At the conferences: Need for translation

Barriers of Communication

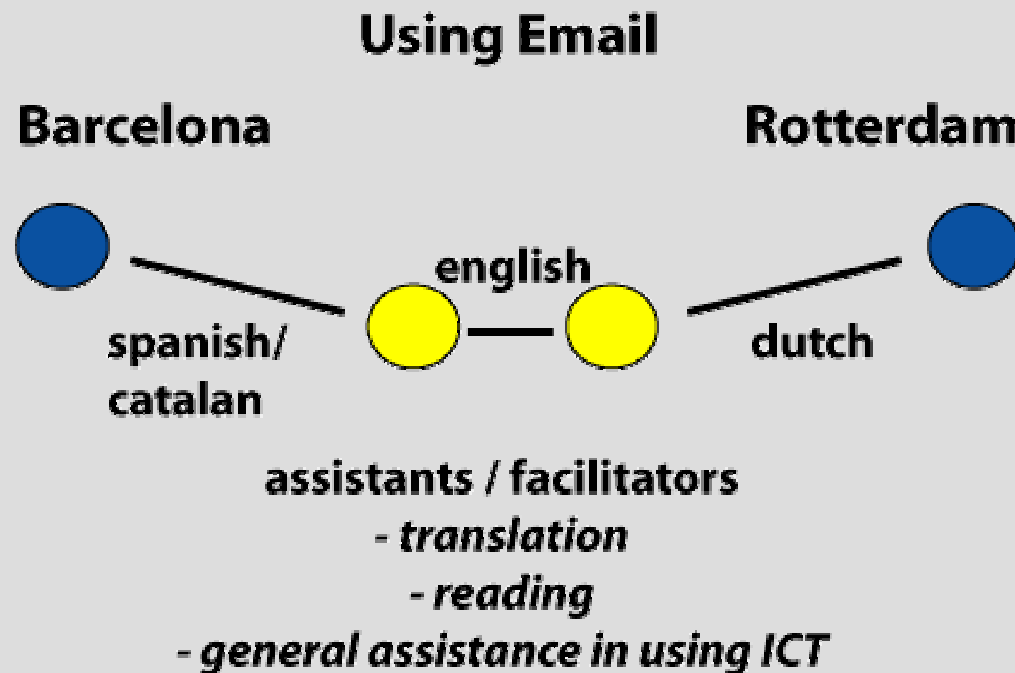
In the communication with people with learning disabilities

- Limited use of ICT
- Little access to ICT
 - Germany: 70% without access to ICT (blind people: 50%)
 - Hamburg advisory group: 13 members, 2 have access to ICT
- Content and Language
 - e.g. Easy-to-Read, Pictures, Pictograms
- Technical barriers
 - e.g. Frame vs. No-Frame
